

Quick Start Guide: Understanding High-Level CPD Requirements (HLRs) for General Practice



As a Specialist General Practitioner, you are required to complete a high-level CPD requirement (HLR) Educational Activity (EA).



What you need to do

A specialist general practitioner must complete a CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) course every three years.



To self-record your completed HLR, please follow these steps.

Self-record on the CPD Home Desktop or App

- 1 Log in to CPD Home or click your App
- 2 From the Dashboard, click the **Upload Activity** button
- 3 Tick **General Practice**
- 4 Enter the details of the activity, including the date, month and year of completion, in the Details section. All fields are mandatory
- 5 Reflect on the learning you have undertaken
- 6 Click **Save**
- 7 Upload your certificate as supporting evidence anytime and remember to click **Save** again.



Edit a CPD activity record uploaded by the Certified Learning Provider on your behalf

If you have completed a CPD activity through an AMA CPD Home Certified Learning Provider or Partner, they will upload your learning record on your behalf (unless otherwise stated on the CPD activity listing). You can edit your CPD activity record to tag it to your mandatory HLR by following the Quick Start Guide: Updating your CPD Activities.

- 1 Log in to CPD Home or click your App
- 2 Click **CPD Activities**
- 3 Click **Uploaded Activities**
- 4 Click the relevant year from the drop-down menu
- 5 Locate the CPD activity you wish to update
- 6 Click **Edit**
- 7 Tick the HLR for **General Practice**
- 8 Click **Save**



Please note: You will not be able to edit HLR activities once you click Save. If you need to edit, please contact us and we will make the changes on your behalf.
